Job Summary:

Ensures the accuracy of investigational drug storage, dispensing and accountability activities in the conduct of clinical trials at Spaulding Clinical. Assists the Pharmacy Manager in directing other Spaulding Clinical personnel who perform preparation, dispensing and documentation functions as necessary for specific studies. Perform all medication management services in compliance with protocol, Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), regulatory guidelines, and Pharmaceutical client's needs.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- As per the delegation log, manages the drug preparation, documentation, administration, and inventory of study drug.
- Communicates and interacts with Sponsors directly on issues of drug shipment and dispensation.
- Tracks drug inventory and orders drug supply from Sponsor.
- Meets with Clinical Research Coordinator and/or other pharmacy/nursing staff to review study medication dispensing procedures and needs for each study.
- Directly dispenses study medication as necessary or works in conjunction with the Clinical Operations staff and coordinators to do so.
- Ensures proper blinding/randomization of study medication and acts as the un-blinded party when necessary for the dispensing of study medication.
- Works in conjunction with the Clinical Operations staff and Coordinators on the preparation of labels and drug accountability forms for studies.
- Ensures proper drug storage, drug accountability and record keeping (e.g., temperature logs, etc.) as well as ensuring proper transportation conditions occurred between manufacture/packager and clinical site.
- Meets with the Clinical Research Coordinators as needed prior to study initiation to review study medication pharmacology, key issues, and plans.
- Contributes toward the creation, development, and implementation of department-wide initiatives including SOPs, and functional improvement initiatives





- Participates in quality assurance of clinical research projects and initiates the need for same as it impacts on clinical/pharmacy practice.
- Participates and collaborates in the presentation of reports and abstracts research proposals while actively involved in pertinent professional organizations.
- Readily accepts responsibility and is accountable for own and delegated activities.
